
Fraserburgh Old Parish Church

Fraserburgh, or "The Broch" as we call it locally is located on the north east tip of Scotland approximately 40 miles north of the city of Aberdeen.







The town of Fraserburgh is situated in the North East Coast of Scotland where the Moray Firth meets the North Sea. It is an attractive town, the older buildings constructed from a lovely grey granite which sparkles in the sunlight. As you approach the town from the south, you pass James Ramsay Park and the Saltoun Gardens giving a very pleasing first impression.

Fishing is the main industry and huge stern trawlers as well as the smaller, chunky prawn fishing boats may be seen in the busy harbour, where the lifeboat is also stationed.

As well as shops in the town centre there are supermarkets - Tesco, Lidl and Asda - on the outskirts.

Education

Education has always been important in Fraserburgh, which was the location of Scotland's first university. Nowadays there is a whole range of educational facilities in the town. A number of nurseries and pre-school playgroups cater for the under- fives and there are four primary schools. A large secondary school, Fraserburgh Academy, serves Fraserburgh and the surrounding area, while the North East Scotland College (NESCol) offers vocational and non-vocational courses in further education.



The well-stocked, bright, airy town library provides a pleasant, comfortable environment for young and old to enjoy reading and using the computers. It also organises book clubs and activities for children.



Fraserburgh Old Parish Church

Serving in Christ's name since 1571



Fraserburgh is served by 3 Church of Scotland charges, the largest being Fraserburgh Old Parish church. The present building dates from 1803, but the original church was built on the same site in 1571.

The "Auld Kirk" is traditionally seen as the parish church and official events such as the Rememberance Day service at the War Memorial are conducted by the Old Parish Church minister.

There is currently about 550 members on the Roll with a regular attendance of about 150 at the morning service and 50 at the evening service. The Kirk Session is some 55 in number.

There is a strong choir who as well as leading the congregation in singing, starts the morning services with various introits, and provides an anthem as part of worship. These are sometimes accompanied by a backing track but more often by our organist Eileen.

The office secretary is employed 4 mornings per week, and printed order of service sheets are prepared for distribution at the church door each Sunday.



O.P.C Church Hall


In the heart of the community

The church hall is located at the junction of High Street and close to the town centre and some 300 meters away from the church.

The building comprises the main hall, a meeting room, various stores, toilets and kitchen all on the ground floor, and two further meeting rooms on the first floor.

A passageway connects the hall building with the adjacent church centre

A vision becomes reality



The opening of the new church centre building in 1990 was the realisation of a vision by the minister and kirk session to provide up to date facilities to accommodate all the church organisations within one complex, and to provide outreach opportunities to the community. This was made possible by the efforts of the congregation, who raised the amazing sum of £250,000 over a relatively short period of time. The ground floor comprises a hall, kitchen, coffee lounge which is open to the public 5 days per week, stores and toilets. A passageway connects the new building to the original hall. On the first floor there is a conference room which is also let out to various bodies commercially and used for providing funeral teas. The minister's office, secretary's office, a resource room and storage rooms are also on this floor.



Thrift Shop





An important service to the community is provided by the Thrift Shop, which offers a wide range of second hand goods. Open from Monday to Saturday (closed Wednesdays) this busy shop is located between our Church and Church Centre on the High Street.

The Manse









The OPC church Manse is a beautiful spacious family home built in 2001. Downstairs there is a kitchen, utility room, toilet, walk-in cloakroom, sitting room, study, dining room and conservatory.

A graceful, wooden staircase leads to a gallery landing on the first floor, which comprises five bedrooms and a family bathroom.

Four of the bedrooms have built in wardrobes with sliding doors. The master bedroom has an en suite shower room.

The property has generous storage space including a large walk in cupboard off the utility room. There is access from the utility room to a double garage, one of the doors being electrically opened.

To the rear of the property there is a large walled garden.




Covenanters is our Sunday evening youth group for age 12 and upwards. The aim is to
